HOW TO APPLY

Applications for the Jamboree must be completed and 'submitted' online.

- <u>Under 18 years old (Scouts and Venturer Scouts)</u>: ensure that both parents and/or guardians (where applicable) sign the Consent page within the online application.
- Leaders, Rovers and Other Adult Members: ensure that the Agreement, Activities and Authority Consent page is signed by yourself.

All Applications must be completed, reviewed, signed and uploaded by 31 March 2024, including having made at least the first payment.

Late applications received by the Contingent after 31 March 2024:

- May be accepted if there is room in the planned Jamboree Unit and/or arranged Contingent travel plans.
- Applicants may not be with their home Unit if Jamboree Units have already been formed and no space is available.
- Applicants cannot be guaranteed any or all the standard Contingent supplied merchandise, nor will there be a reduction in the amount
 payable if some items are not available.
- All applications will close on 31 August 2024.

Acknowledgement of receipt of your Application and First Payment will be by way of a **Welcome to the Western Australian Contingent Newsletter**, which will be received via email to your main, validated email address entered on your Online Application.

LEADER ROLES

Leaders need to nominate preferences for Jamboree roles. We'll endeavour to match you to your preferences but please recognise that this won't always be possible. All role allocations will be completed by the Contingent Support Team in conjunction with the Jamboree Executive Committee.

ALL PARTICIPANTS - RESPONSIBILITY

- The Contingent Support Team with the Jamboree Executive Committee reserves the right to send a participant home at own expense if there is a significant breach of behaviour expectations or genuine under-preparedness for event.
- In the unlikely event the Jamboree is cancelled there is no right to refund.
- To make sure you get the most out of the Jamboree make sure you are prepared by:
- Scouts:
 - o Be able to pack your own bags (you need to know what you have and where it is)
 - Be able to manage your personal hygiene, including washing your clothes by hand
 - Have learnt good camping skills through achievement of Pioneer Campcraft prior to the Jamboree.
 - Have basic kitchen skills washing up, food preparation, cooking meals, etc.
 - o Note that contact with Mum and Dad will not be possible every day as you are going to be too busy having FUN
- For all Participants:
 - Can work as part of a team
 - Be prepared to have fun
 - Keep medical & contact details up to date in the application system
 - Bring your medication!
 - o Be able to cope with the physical requirements of the event

TRANSPORT

- Travel arrangements will be co-ordinated by the Western Australia Contingent and advised closer to the event.
- Please allow a day on either side of the official Jamboree dates for travel. Most members of the Contingent will depart Western Australia on 5 January 2025 and return on 16 January 2025.

INDEPENDENT TRAVEL

- Independent Travel for youth members in the Contingent will only be considered in extenuating circumstances.
- Line Leaders must travel with their respective Jamboree Unit.
- Independent Travel for non-Unit based Contingent members will only be considered in extenuating circumstances.
- Decisions on Independent Travel requests may not be made until after Unit allocations (expected to be in June 2024).
- The drop-off time for Independent Travellers will be 10:00am on 6 January 2025.
- The pick-up time for Independent Travellers will be 9:00am on 16 January 2025.
- The drop-off and pick-up location for Independent Travellers will be Corner Alice Street and Aldridge Street, Maryborough.

WHAT'S INCLUDED IN THE TOTAL FEE

- Eleven days to create "Your Quest You Way" meeting new friends and participating in activities, both on-site and off-site.
- All meals and accommodation for the duration of the Jamboree.
- Meals, accommodation, and activities for the Pre-Jamboree Camp on 21-23 September 2024.
- Personal travel insurance to cover personal equipment loss or damage.
- Transport of camping equipment between Western Australia and the Jamboree site.
- Welfare support for the duration of the Jamboree.
- Return travel to the Jamboree site from an airport in Western Australia. Some regional travel to Perth Airport for the onward flight to Brisbane may be via road coach.
- Jamboree merchandise: shirt, hat, scarf, badge.
- Contingent merchandise: shirt, travel bag, Western Australia state scarf, Contingent badge, unit badges, drink bottle.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

• Limited funds from the Lord Baden-Powell Society and Scouts WA will be made available to selected eligible Contingent members. Details regarding the financial support, including the application process, will be available online at www.ajwa.com.au in due course.

POST-TOUR

- The Western Australian Contingent is offering an optional Post-Tour on the Gold Coast following the Jamboree. The Post-Tour will operate from 16 January till 21 January 2025 (five nights).
- The Post-Tour will include a range of activities to choose from, such as Gold Coast theme parks, Brisbane city adventure, North Stradbroke Island experience, Springbrook and Lamington National Parks, Tree-Top Challenge Gold Coast, Ripley's Believe It or Not!, Australia Zoo, and much more! Additional information regarding the optional Post-Tour is available at www.ajwa.com.au.
- The optional Post-Tour is an additional \$1,220. This fee includes all activities, catering, transport, and dormitory accommodation.
- A total of 170 places are available on the Post-Tour. These places will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis (except for adult members, as outlined below).
- Youth members please note: if you select 'Yes' to attend the Post-Tour in your online application, and your overall application to attend AJ2025 as a member of the Western Australian Contingent is approved, then your place on the Post-Tour is automatically confirmed.
- Adult members please note: our optional Post-Tour is a youth-focused activity. For adult members, selecting 'Yes' to attend the Post-Tour in your online application indicates your interest in attending the Post-Tour; however, your Post-Tour place is not confirmed until advised by the Contingent Support Team. Should the number of adult applicants exceed the number of adults required to safely operate the Post-Tour, a selection process will be undertaken to select adult members for the Post-Tour.
