Role objective	Be the voice of Jamboree participants on the Contingent Support Team.
Role overview	<p>As a key member of the Contingent Support Team, you will be supported by the Contingent Leader and Deputy Contingent Leader to be the voice of youth members in the Western Australian Contingent. The Contingent Leader and Deputy Contingent Leader will be your mentors to help you grow into this role over the next 18 months.</p> <p>Your key task is to be the voice of youth participants. Additionally, you will be part of a smaller team responsible for one of the following elements of the Contingent: Health & Wellbeing, Administration & Finance, Travel, Program, Logistics or Marketing & Communications. Being a member of one of these teams will provide you an opportunity to develop specific skills in leading a Contingent whilst having the opportunity to contribute to the bigger picture.</p> <p>This role is a development opportunity for current youth members who are interested in future roles on Contingent Teams or major event teams.</p>
Specific responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promote the Jamboree to fellow youth members at Branch events and as part of the Jamboree Roadshow. • Participate in decision making to craft a valued, youth-led Jamboree experience. • Be an active member of one of the following teams: Health & Wellbeing, Administration & Finance, Operations, Program, or Marketing & Communications. • Plan and deliver a Patrol Leader training event before the Jamboree. • Plan and deliver a program for the Pre-Jamboree Camp. • Create a Contingent Council and leverage that forum to engage youth members in the process of Plan>Do>Review. • Represent Western Australia and collaborate with youth leaders from other Branch Contingents. • Be a mentor to all youth members attending the event.

<p>Qualifications and experience</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be registered as a current youth member now and up until the Jamboree in January 2025. • Previous experience at a major Scout event (experience as a participant at a previous Australian Scout Jamboree is highly desirable).
<p>Time commitment</p>	<p>You will be required to commit time for this role. From July 2026, your commitment will be around 1-2 hours per week as we plan this Jamboree experience for youth members across Western Australia. From January 2027, your commitment will ramp up to 4-5 hours per week as we head into the 12-months leading up to the Jamboree in December 2027.</p> <p>Applicants should ensure they have the flexibility in their time to be able to accommodate this contribution considering their current commitments. They should be available during the lead up to and the full duration of the event including as a member of the advance and rear party. This is a volunteer position.</p>
